***You must be at least age 25 by this coming Sept. 1 to qualify for any of these scholarships.**

Please read the criteria for each scholarship carefully, and check the corresponding box(es) for those you wish to be considered. Feel free to apply for any and all scholarships for which you qualify.

Check the corresponding boxes for scholarships you qualify for and wish to be considered for!

Timothy M. Emerson Memorial Scholarship – \$400

- You must be a graduate of Corry Area High School or have been a resident of the Corry Area School District since at least June 1, 2008, and turn at least age 25 by Sept. 1, 2009.
- You must be accepted into an associate degree or higher program at a college, university or technical school.
- You must be taking at least 18 credits in the upcoming school year.

Zonta Club of Corry Adult Scholarship – \$1,000

- You must be a graduate of Corry or Union City high schools, or have been a resident of the Corry or Union City school districts since at least June 1, 2008, and turn at least age 25 by Sept. 1, 2009.
- You must be accepted into a certificate program, associate degree program or higher at a college, university or technical school, and be taking at least 6 credits in the upcoming school year.

Kelly Thomas Adult Scholarship – \$2,000

- You must be a graduate of Corry or Union City high schools, or have been a resident of the Corry or Union City school districts since at least June 1, 2008, and turn at least age 25 by Sept. 1, 2009.
- You must be accepted into a certificate program, associate degree program or higher at a college, university or technical school, and be taking at least 6 credits in the upcoming school year.

Mary Stewart Hubley Adult Scholarship – \$5,000

- You must be a resident of the Corry, Union City or Clymer school districts, or be a graduate of Corry, Union City or Clymer high schools.
- You must turn at least age 25 by Sept. 1, 2009.
- You must be sophomore-level or higher this fall (**at least 30 credits already completed**).
- You must be in a program leading to a degree or vocational/technical certificate, with a clear academic or vocational/technical major (i.e. not general education).
- You must be taking at least 12 credits in the upcoming school year.

Rebecca A. Lewis Memorial Adult Scholarship – \$750

- You must be a resident of the Corry, Union City or Clymer school districts, or be a graduate of Corry, Union City or Clymer high schools.
- You must turn at least age 25 by Sept. 1, 2009.
- You must be accepted into a certificate program, associate degree program or higher at a college, university or technical school, and be taking at least 3 credits per semester in the upcoming school year and contributing financially to your education at least equal to the amount of the scholarship.

This Application Must Include the Following!
 (Please use this as a check list to ensure the completeness of your application.)

- A copy of your 2008 state tax return, and that of your spouse if married.
- If you are not married but are living with and sharing expenses with a “significant other,” also submit a copy of that person’s 2008 state tax return.
- If previously enrolled, submit a copy of your college transcript or most recent report card showing your GPA. (Unofficial transcripts or printouts from your school’s website are acceptable)
- If not previously enrolled, please submit a copy of the acceptance letter from your school.
- Submit the names and telephone numbers of two references (not family members) who can speak about your commitment to your education. Please indicate their relationship to you. (i.e. instructor, employer, etc.)
- Submit a short essay explaining your education and career goals that may be helpful in evaluating your application, including your financial need.
- Submit a copy of the Financial Aid Award letter from your school.
- Submit a copy of Page 1 from your FAFSA Student Aid Report that shows your “Expected Family Contribution.”

2009-10 Tuition Worksheet

The intent of this worksheet is to determine your actual “out-of-pocket” expense for tuition in the coming school year. This is for tuition only....not textbooks, fees, travel, room & board, meals, etc.

- 1) Enter the **cost per credit** of the school you are attending \$
(can be obtained from school website or financial office)
- 2) Enter the **number of credits** you expect to take in the 2009-10 school year (including summer 2010) \$
- 3) Multiply lines 1 x 2 to determine your tuition expense \$
- 4) Enter the total amount of state and federal grants you are scheduled to receive for the entire school year from PHEAA and PELL. \$
- 5) Subtract line 4 from line 3 \$
- 6) Enter the total of all scholarships you have been awarded, and any free aid you are receiving from the school you are attending \$
- 7) Subtract line 6 from line 5 \$

- ◆ All applicants will be notified regarding the status of their application by late July.
- ◆ Scholarship checks will be made out to both the selected applicants and to their schools. Checks will be issued in August.
- ◆ Applicants who draw down scholarship funds in a particular semester but who withdraw from school without completing that semester must repay that and any other remaining funding to the Corry Higher Education Council.
- ◆ If you withdraw from school without using the entire scholarship, please notify the Council.
